POSITION SUMMARY:	<p>Full-time position with the San Joaquin Valley Public Health Consortium through the California State University, Fresno Foundation. The San Joaquin Valley Public Health Consortium (Consortium) is a membership organization composed of eleven Public Health Departments – Calaveras, Fresno, Kings, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, San Benito, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Tulare and Tuolumne Counties. The Consortium provides leadership for a regional health agenda that addresses the social determinants of health in the San Joaquin Valley and adjoining mountain communities with an aim to achieve health equity for all residents. In partnership with Central California Center for Health and Human Services at California State University, Fresno, the Consortium engages in strategic planning, training, action-oriented policy development and research to improve the quality and responsiveness of public health programs in the Central California region. This position is a full-time benefited (based on available funding) Foundation exempt position.</p> <p>Under the direction of the Director, the Data Scientist will provide leadership and technical support for Consortium data projects as part of larger efforts to increase health equity throughout the San Joaquin Valley.</p>
ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:	<p>Under the supervision of the Consortium Director, the incumbent will be responsible for the following operations. Typical duties include, but are not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lead Consortium efforts to adopt regional data standards, including incorporating equity principles into regional data projects and other Consortium efforts. • Facilitate meetings between local health department’s data staff and other partners. • Identify gaps in regional data and strategies for implementing solutions. • Collaborate with Local Health Departments and partner organizations to identify barriers and solutions to data sharing, understanding data, and utilizing data at a regional level. • Act as a technical expert for data obtained by or analyzed by the Consortium. • As needed, develop and apply methods to identify, collect, process, organize, and analyze structured and unstructured data using statistical prediction, inference, and optimization; effectively communicate results to Consortium members, partners, and decision makers to support data-driven program design and management. • Develops relationships with local academic data science programs to foster recruitment of data science interns and is responsible for overseeing their work on Consortium data science projects. • Support the planning, designing and managing of research projects, surveys, and other data collection projects to augment existing sources of data as necessary to solve identified problems. • Develops and presents visualizations of findings and recommendations that can be used to support decisions and allocate resources. • Other duties as assigned.

Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Bachelor’s degree from an accredited college or university in a field of applied research such as Data Science, Machine Learning, Mathematics, Statistics, Business Analytics, Psychology, or Public Health that included 12 semester or 18 quarter units of coursework in data science, predictive analytics, quantitative research methods, or statistical analysis • Masters’ degree in Public Health from a program accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health or a Master’s degree on a related field. Five (5) years of related professional experience may be substituted for a Master’s degree. • Two (2) to five (5) years of full-time professional experience in public health or related field.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One (1) years of management/organizational development experience (preferred but not required). • Current or previous employment in a state or local government agency (preferred but not required). • Competence in the Public Health 10 Essential Functions and how these operate in local public health departments. • Demonstrated ability with a variety of data analysis methods (both quantitative and qualitative) and skilled utilization of a variety data analysis software (may include Stata, R, SPSS, SAS, NVivo, Atlas.ti, Tableau, or others) • Understanding of the social determinants of health and, in particular, health equity and how these factors influence the health and well-being of populations. • Knowledge of the demographic, socio-economic, environmental, political, and health indicators of the Consortium's region. • Understanding of local and state government operations. • Familiarity with epidemiological data and how to use data to communicate public health issues. • Proficiency in the communication of complex issues in meaningful oral, written, visual, and web-based forms for a variety of audiences. • Aptitude in group facilitation. • Ability to work independently, take initiative and offer strategic visionary approaches. • Experience working with a broad range of agencies, organizations, and communities. • Skill in use of standard computer programs, such as Word, PowerPoint, Excel, etc. • Valid driver's license and reliable vehicle with required insurance, as driving is a requirement of the position.
