## FIELD BASED TRAINER (Ventura County) – CENTRAL CALIFORNIA TRAINING ACADEMY

<b>POSITION SUMMARY:</b>	<p><b>Full-time, benefited position with the Central California Training Academy through the California State University, Fresno Foundation. The time base for this position may vary between 50% (20 hour per week) to 100% time (40 hours per week) depending on county needs.</b> The Academy is a collaborative project involving the California State University, Fresno College of Health and Human Services, the Central California Welfare Directors, and the California Department of Social Services. The Academy provides 12 county welfare departments with a competency-based child welfare-training program that links pre-service education induction for new staff and continuing in-service training. Training is delivered at regional sites throughout Central California under the direction of the Academy Project Director.</p>
<b>ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:</b>	<p>Under the direction of the Integration Project Manager and in collaboration with Ventura County, the Field Based Trainer will serve as the on-site Field Based Trainer for the County. Duties will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Coach social work supervisors on their role as educators, trainers, and coaches in order to provide effective leadership to build and maintain a skilled workforce.</li> <li>• Provide ongoing coaching support to supervisors in implementing evidenced based practice to achieve agency outcomes as well as federal and state outcomes.</li> <li>• Provide transfer of learning and skill activities for new and experienced social work staff.</li> <li>• Arrange, schedule, and provide ongoing training and coaching for new and transferred social workers and supervisors in coordination with Staff Development Administrative Specialist and training unit Supervisors.</li> <li>• Provide on-going evaluation of the effectiveness of the field-based training-coaching program.</li> <li>• Conduct ongoing small group training sessions with social workers and supervisors related to competencies, skills, values, and knowledge of child welfare training.</li> <li>• Continually assess training curriculum and develop or enhance existing materials.</li> <li>• Identify system issues and make recommendations to County leadership regarding policies and procedures that best support and achieve agency outcomes.</li> <li>• Other duties may be assigned.</li> </ul>
